Summer Term

Welcome back! This term our theme will be *Being Outside* and *Let's Celebrate!* We'll learn all about different animals, and plants. We will even do some planting of our own!

Communication, Language and Literacy

We will be learning to:

- Continuing to say and write our Set 1 sounds in the Read, Write Inc.
- Listen to stories and answer questions about them
- Have conversations with each other and take turns speaking
- Try lots of different mark making activities and tell others about what we have written, drawn or painted
- Write our names.

At home you could:

- Practise writing sounds and mark making in different ways, such as using our fingers to write sounds in messy things like shaving foam or sand

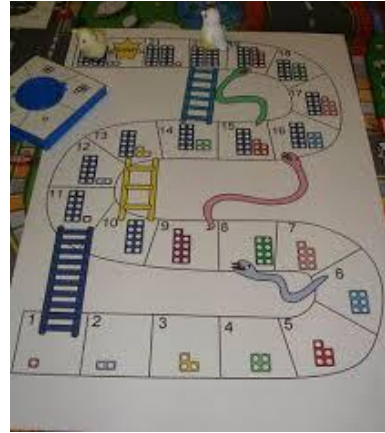
Maths

We will be learning to:

- Count objects by touching each one as we say the number
- Recognise, order and write numbers to 5 and beyond!
- Begin to use ordering language such as first, next, then and before.
- Name shapes and talk about what they look like.
- Understand and talk about different forms of measurement, such as length and weight.

At home you could:

- Go on a shape hunt around your home
- Play counting games such as hide and seek together



Play board games together to practise counting skills



Help at Home!

Build things together using different construction materials, such as blocks or Lego. Talk to your child about the shapes they are using and how they are making it.



Try rolling a dice, then counting and writing the number of dots. You could even make your own dice with higher numbers to try and challenge your child. They could also roll three or four numbers then try to put them in order.



Try cooking together at home! You could talk about the weight and feel of different ingredients or count out different ingredients to add, such as toppings to put on pizza!

Personal, Social, Emotional Development

We will be learning to:

- Build the friendships we formed in Spring
- Share and be patient while waiting for our turn
- Take pride in our independent work and creations

At home you could:

- Arrange play dates and attend groups with your child to help boost social skills and form relationships

Physical Development

We'll explore new physical challenges through team games and gymnastics this term!

We will be learning to:

- Explore different forms of dance
- Work together during Team Games
- Move safely and use equipment safely
- Improve our fine motor skills through lots of cutting, threading and tracing activities
- Keep healthy by learning about good hygiene and healthy eating

At home you could:

- Ensure your child eats healthily, balanced meals and talk about why we eat certain things
- Take your child outside to play in the garden or a park

We will learning about:

- Growth
- Cycles
- Plants
- Weather
- Celebrations
- Special Accomplishments
- How to be an independent learner

At home you could:

- Take your child on a Nature Walk and talk about what you can find
- Go to the library and learn new things about our topics that they can share with our class
- Grow your own plants

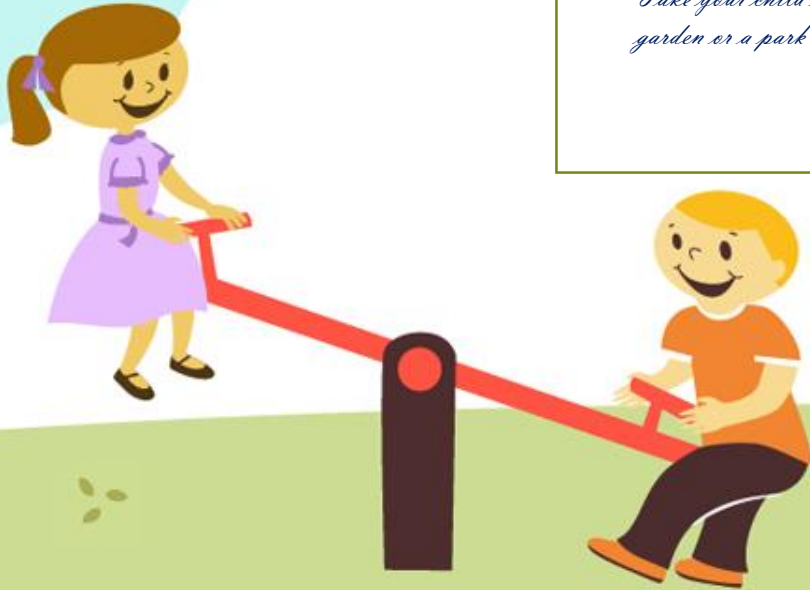
Expressive Arts & Design
