BREAKFAST CLUB

Thank you to our regular parents who are keeping their children's Breakfast Club accounts in credit on Parent Pay. Any child from Reception - Year 6 can attend each day (doors open at 7.45am, and children can be admitted until 8.20am).

The school charges £1/day for families who are entitled to benefit-related free school meals and £2/day for all other families. This daily charge will need to be paid via Parent Pay before your child arrives at Breakfast Club.

Thank you to all our parents for supporting the school by ensuring their child is in class and ready to learn at 8.50am each day as children can find it unsettling when they are late. If you have problems with attendance, please speak to Mrs Papadakis or Mrs Winter. A reminder to all parents that the school does not authorise holiday during school time. We ask that parents call the school office before 8.45am if your child will be absent for any reason.

Whole school attendance from the start of term is 94.1% and for the week beginning 29th January was 92.6%. Our school target is 96%.

Online safety

Many of us see our online lives and offline lives as different. But for children growing up with technology and the internet, there is not a difference - online life and offline life is just life.

Technology can move at an extraordinary fast pace so it can be difficult to know how to start talking to your child about what they are doing online, who they might be speaking to or discussing potential risks and issues. Talking regularly with your child can help keep them safe online. Making it part of daily conversation, like you would about their day at school, will help your child feel relaxed. It also means when they do have any worries, they're more likely to come and speak to you.

But it's easy to become overwhelmed with the different technology, the language that children use, the huge number of games and apps which are available and the potential risks.

Once again the West of London Astronomical Society invites you to observe the Moon and stars. Friday 16th Feb - Sunday 18th Feb 2024.

Time 6.00 pm to 8.00 pm. If the sky is clear, a quarter Moon will be visible along with Jupiter and Uranus. Other objects include the Andromeda Galaxy and the Orion Nebula.

Bring family and friends to this FREE event - member of WOLAS will be on hand with a variety of their telescopes and will be able to answer any questions you may have.

Telescopes will have coloured lamps indicating the target - change colour to change target!
