



DENTAL HEALTH

Some of our classes are taking part in the NHS toothrushing programme to encourage children to brush their teeth regularly. Her is some information we have received from the programme's facilitator:

- Hillingdon has 28.2% of 5-Year-old children with decayed, missing or filled teeth which is above the England average.
- More 5–9-year-old children are hospitalized due to tooth decay than for any other reason.

Thank you to all our parents for supporting the school by ensuring their child is in class and ready to learn at 8.50am each day as children can find it unsettling when they are late.
