
As a parent, you know how difficult and relentless parenting small children can be - even without other challenges. You can use your experience in this role to **change the lives** of struggling parents.

Although they do ask for a commitment of a year before they are able to provide a reference, many of our volunteers have used their experience volunteering with us to help them find work in a similar field.

Volunteers need to be parents and have at least half a day a week (during normal working hours) to commit to the role as well as attending our thorough, 40 hour Volunteer Training Course (8 sessions in school hours).

Many young people who are victims of cyberbullying suffer in silence. They feel they cannot turn to parents or a trusted adult for support as they fear they may get in trouble or have their devices taken away from them. It can carry on all day, all evening and all weekend for the world to see, causing a lot of emotional stress to the victim and their family. It can very quickly lead to the victim feeling trapped, scared and vulnerable to grooming and blackmail.
